
So let us be about the journey, And walk towards the cross.

#### The Word around the Bush

Mark 1: 9-15

9 In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. 11 And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

12 And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. 13 He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

14 Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, 15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

- •How do you hear the reading from Mark and what does the wilderness means to you?
- •I wonder what you heard in the Word for our church?
- •What one action can you or your church take in response to the Word today?

## Silence in Two Ways

Spend some time in silence sitting still (suggested 5 minutes). Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert.

- •You may like to say the prayer phrase "Mar-anath-a" (which means come Lord). Say this as four syllables. Do not try to think or imagine anything. If thoughts or distractions come simply return to saying the word.
- •Or you may like "sitting with God" a silent time in which we focus all our mind, heart and soul on the presence of God without trying to create it. Simply be still and open to God.

## Prayers for Others

In our simple faith, we bring our prayers for your creation and for the people of this world.

We pray for places where faithfulness struggles to survive.

Silence

We pray for places isolated, cut off, hard to bear and for those who find themselves there.

We pray for those who find themselves in a time of dying.

We pray for those who live with fear, loneliness, abandonment and pain.

We pray for ourselves and others who sit on our hearts and minds.
