The Word around the Bush

John 1:1-18 1In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. 6There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. 14And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. 15 (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.")¹⁶From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has ever seen God. Silence in Two Ways

Spend some time in silence sitting still (suggested 5 minutes). Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert.

- •You may like to say the prayer phrase "Mar-an-ath-a" (which means come Lord). Say this as four syllables. Do not try to think or imagine anything. If thoughts or distractions come simply return to saying the word.
- •Or you may like "sitting with God" a silent time in which we focus all our mind, heart and soul on the presence of God without trying to create it. Simply be still and open to God.

Prayers for Others

O God, Light dispelling the darkness, we pray for the world, in its yearning for signs of good and hope, in its fears that nothing will ever change enough for free and just life to be given to its people. *Silence*

We pray for those who look with longing eyes for tiny signs that there are better things to come, who clutch the fragments of survival as though tomorrow they may never see the dawn. Especially we pray for these people and situations: *The people pray*

Come in new possibilities among them Jesus Christ. As we celebrate your coming in gifts and gatherings of plenty, we make our commitment to them, the commitment that we will not forget them on this day or the next.

And at this time when, for many people, betrayals and loneliness become stark, like the bare bones of death confronting the fullness of life as they see those who enjoy the privilege of love, we pray that you will hold them close to your heart.

Be with all those who find this season a mockery and painful reminder of who they are and what their life is like

Join us in every place Jesus Christ. Visit us whoever we are and wherever we are this day, we pray in your name ^{1.} Amen.
