The Word around the Bush

Mark 12:28-34

²⁸One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" ²⁹Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; ³⁰you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' 31The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." 32Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; 33 and 'to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbour as oneself,' —this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." 34When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." After that no one dared to ask him any question.

The Message

Questions for conversation

- •I wonder what you have heard and thought from the Word today?
- •I wonder what you heard in the Word for our church?
- •What one action can you or your church take in response to the Word today?

Silence in Two Ways

Spend some time in silence sitting still (suggested 5 minutes). Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert.

- •You may like to say the prayer phrase "Mar-an-ath-a" (which means come Lord). Say this as four syllables. Do not try to think or imagine anything. If thoughts or distractions come simply return to saying the word.
- •Or you may like "sitting with God" a silent time in which we focus all our mind, heart and soul on the presence of God without trying to create it. Simply be still and open to God.

Prayers for Others

Ever present God, as you show your love for us in relationship with you. We pray that we continue to look for your love, to hear your voice, to feel your touch and to have the Spirit of Life breathe upon us your life-giving grace. Help us to love: to love you, to love ourselves as we love our neighbour. (pause)

For those who are shut out and shunned by the injustices they experience each day as they are judged by gender, race, class and religion. **May we show our neighbour love.**

(pause)

For the planet and all living things that fight for survival against the insatiable plunder of human excess. **May we show our neighbour love.** (pause)

We know you are with those who are experiencing difficult days in our communities, may we be free to share our lives with them also. **May we show our neighbour love.**

(pause)

In this time of silence, we bring you our prayers. May we feel your love and acceptance to the depth of our being.

(pause)

In Christ, Amen.
