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The Word around the Bush

John 1:1-14

1In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴in him was life, and the life was the light of all people.

⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

The Message

From your Scattered Community Minister or another leader within your gathering.

Questions for conversation

- •I wonder what you have heard and thought from the Word today?
- •I wonder what you heard in the Word for our church?
- •What one action can you or your church take in response to the Word today?

Silence in Two Ways

Spend some time in silence sitting still (suggested 5 minutes). Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert.

- •You may like to say the prayer phrase "Mar-an-ath-a" (which means come Lord). Say this as four syllables. Do not try to think or imagine anything. If thoughts or distractions come simply return to saying the word.
- ●Or you may like "sitting with God" a silent time in which we focus all our mind, heart and soul on the presence of God without trying to create it. Simply be still and open to God.

Prayers for Others

O God, on this day of all days, we pray for the world, in its yearnings for signs of good and hope, in its fears that nothing will ever change enough for a free and just life to be given to its people. (silent reflection)

We pray for those who look with longing eyes for any tiny sign that there are better things to come, who clutch the fragments of survival as though tomorrow they may never see the dawn. (silent reflection)

Come in new possibilities amongst us all. For a renewed creation, a just and fair world, where talk of peace and fellowship drown out the drums of discord and war and where we may again know that God is with us and we are with God.

Join us in every place, Jesus Christ.

Visit us whoever we are and wherever we are on this day, we pray in your name. Amen. *
