The Word around the Bush

Matthew 5:1-12

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. ²Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

³"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 4"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. 5"Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. 6"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. ⁷"Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. 8"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. 9"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. ¹⁰"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 11" Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. 12 Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Silence in Two Ways

Spend some time in silence sitting still (suggested 5 minutes). Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert.

Prayers for Others

Loving God.

Give us the will and courage to intercede on behalf of others, putting ourselves in service of those who mourn, to the meek, of those who seek peace and to the merciful. Give us strength to be strong for others. (pause for silent prayer)

Give us the wisdom to intercede on behalf of others, putting ourselves in service of those who have been slandered, exploited, humiliated and despised. Give us the wisdom to wise counsel and advocate for others. (pause for silent prayer)

Give us the humility to intercede for others, putting ourselves in the service of those who are ignored, overlooked and denied their dignity. Give us the humility to recognise our common humanity and the grace that binds us, one to another. (pause for silent prayer)

Where is the one who is wise? Let it be us, but wise with your wisdom: not as the world demands; not intent on getting ahead but committed to bringing others along.

We see your way, a better way, and we pray for the will and the wisdom to follow, with open hearts.
