We see the faces of our political leaders, and we pray for them.

We see the faces of our own aboriginal people, and we pray for them.

We see the faces of the Christian church, and we pray for them.

We see the faces of people within our own church, and we pray for them.

We see the faces of people we know who are sick, or sad, or who are weeping, and we pray for them.

We see the faces of our families, the people we love and struggle to love, and we pray for them.

We see our own faces, and we pray for ourselves.

Lord Jesus Christ, lover of all people and all faces, in all places, gather us to yourself, and inspire us to live our own prayers, that there would be peace, that our world would be hope-filled, that there would be justice and mercy, that there would be wholeness, and that within this world, there would be faithfulness.

Lord Jesus Christ, let ours be your peace.

We pray.
