The Word around the Bush

Luke 14:1-14

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely.

⁷When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them a parable. 8"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; ⁹and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ¹⁰But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. 11 For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." 12He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. 13 But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Questions for conversation

- How do you show humility? (Please remember humility is not subservience but more about being grounded and authentic)
- •How do we live out the purposes of God, the reign of God in our lives: personally and as a Christian community?

Silence

Spend some time in silence sitting still (suggested 5 minutes). Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert. Don't worry too much if your mind is filled with other thoughts, allow them to drift away like a feather on the wind.

Prayers for Others

All loving God, you offer a life that raises us from focussing on small and insignificant things, to a larger view, that expands horizons for us and the world. You invite us to live humble and authentic lives. At this time we come with out prayers for others.

We pray for people who stick by the rules to the exclusion of love and grace, limiting their own experience of wholeness or that being offered to another.

We pray for those who see another as being of lesser value or worth, disregarding another's value as a child of God, and, in the process, also devaluing their own worth.

We pray for those on whom heavy burdens are placed, bending them love and placing limits on their lives.

When we are complicit in burdening others unfairly with poor wages, inadequate living conditions, unjust policies or insufficient welfare, lift our view to see with your compassionate eyes.

Help us to notice those who others walk past. Help us to lift heavy burdens, to invite the stranger to our tables of love, to enable all to live into the hope and freedom you offer.

Through, Jesus Christ, the one offers freedom to all, we pray. Amen. *
